### **Change for Financial Aid Recipients - Effective Fall Semester 2009**

The Department of Education has recently provided new information that requires a change in our policy regarding disbursement of federal financial aid effective Fall Semester 2009.

Registration hours will now be “frozen” at the end of the schedule adjustment period (drop/add) and these hours will be used to determine a student’s financial aid eligibility for the entire semester. Previously a student could add a second half semester class later in the semester and their financial aid would be adjusted to pay for those additional hours provided there was eligibility remaining.

With this change registration must be finalized before the Freeze Date in order to be covered by financial aid. The Freeze Date for Fall Semester is Aug. 21, 2009. Additional information as well as Freeze Dates for all semesters will be posted on the Financial Aid website.

### **Clayton State Summer Athletic Camps – Running Through the End of July**

The Clayton State University summer athletics camps have started for 2009. The athletics camps will run through Friday, July 31 and are designed to provide the highest quality instruction in a safe, fun and socially enriching environment for children ages six to 17. The primary goal is for all campers to enjoy themselves while learning and improving their skills.

This year's individual sport full-day and half-day camps include; cheerleading, boys and girls basketball, soccer, speed development, and tennis. The cheerleading camp (June 29 to July 3), plus the soccer, tennis and speed camps, are co-ed. Separate camps are held in basketball for both boys and girls.

Starting today, co-ed combination sport camps are being held in the following sports; soccer/speed, soccer/basketball, tennis/soccer, tennis/speed, and tennis/basketball. There are also two overnight soccer team camps, one for boys (July 30 to Aug. 2) and one for girls (July 19 to July 23).

Clayton State is a NCAA Division II school that competes in the Peach Belt Conference. All camps are on the Clayton State campus.

Daily activities are led by Clayton State Laker head and assistant coaches and focus on character building aspects of each individual sport, including self-esteem, discipline and responsibility. The Clayton State athletic camps combine small group instruction as well as game play to ensure development of fundamental skills and game knowledge. Full day instruction runs from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., however, supervision is provided upon request from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

## **School of Business Seminar Addresses New Changes in Labor Law, June 19**

On Jan. 29, President Barack Obama signed into law the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act of 2009. The Act overturns the controversial 2007 Supreme Court decision in Ledbetter v. Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company and amends not only Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, but also the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Rehabilitation Act, and the Age Discrimination in Employment Act. As a result, it applies not only to gender discrimination, but also discrimination based on race, national origin, religion, age, and disability.

To learn more about the impact the Fair Play Act and other employment law changes will have on Georgia businesses, register for the Clayton State University School of Business' Labor and Employment Law Seminar and Certification on Friday, June 19, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the classroom of the School of Business Building on the Clayton State main campus in Morrow.

The seminar will be taught by Dr. Judith Ogden, Clayton State University associate professor of Accounting, and S.L. Macey, a former judge from Indianapolis, In., and a graduate of Indiana University Law School who is currently an arbitrator in Colorado with Judicial Arbitration Group. ## **Two Clayton State "Alumni" Featured in NARA Civil War Workshop, June 27**

Two of Clayton State University's distinguished historian "alumni" will be making presentations at an upcoming workshop on the Civil War, to be held at the National Archives and Records Administration's (NARA) Southeast Region Archives on Saturday, June 27.

Although technically not a Clayton State alumnus, retired Professor of History Dr. Gene Hatfield will be speaking on "The Atlanta Campaign and the Battle of Jonesboro" at 2 p.m. on June 27 as one of the two lecturers in a day of information at the NARA facility, 5780 Jonesboro Rd., Morrow. (Also lecturing at 1 p.m. will be journalist Alan Huffman, author of the new book, "Sultana: Surviving the Civil War, Prison, and the Worst Maritime Disaster in American History.")

The morning of June 27 at NARA will be devoted to a Workshop on Resources for Study of the Civil War. Among the presenters for the workshop will be Clayton State alumnus, graduate student and NARA archives technician Shane Bell. His 10:30 a.m. presentation will be on "Civil War Records Online" and will focus on the efforts of the National Archives to provide greater access to its vast holdings via the Internet.

The workshop, which is sponsored by NARA and the Friends of the National Archives – Southeast Region ([www.friendsnas.org](http://www.friendsnas.org)), will run from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Included in the \$10 registration fee are Hatfield's and Huffman's (who will also have a book signing) lectures, four resource presentations (including Bell's), lunch, an ice cream social at 3 p.m., and a special presentation by the 104<sup>th</sup> Illinois Volunteer Infantry.
