### **Spivey Hall to Conclude 2008/2009 Season with Young Artists**

Youth will be served at Clayton State University's Spivey Hall next weekend, as the 2008/2009 season comes to a close with three performances by outstanding young singers.

On Friday, May 15, the Spivey Hall Young Artists and the Spivey Hall Children's Choir, conducted by Craig Hurley and Dr. Martha Shaw, and accompanied by Steven Wooddell and Judy Mason on the piano, will perform at 7 p.m.

This spring concert showcases the achievements of the Spivey Hall Young Artists, who sing with spirit and beauty under the direction of Hurley and accompanied by Wooddell. To cap off their year, the Young Artists give a program that includes performances with the Spivey Hall Children's Choir under the direction of Shaw, marking another successful season of extraordinary music making for all 170 students - the finest young singers in Georgia.

Tickets to this performance are \$10 (50 percent off for Clayton State faculty and staff).

On Saturday, May 16 and Sunday May 17, the Children's Choir and the Spivey Hall Tour Choir, conducted by Shaw with Mason at the piano, will bring its year and the 2008/2009 Spivey Series to a close with two wonderful concerts - demonstrating once again why the Spivey Hall Children's Choir Program enjoys an international reputation for artistic excellence. Both concerts will start at 3 p.m. The advanced singers of the Tour Choir, Spivey Hall's marvelous musical ambassadors, give a preview of selections to be performed on their annual summer concert tour.

### **Library to be Closed During the Week of May 18 to May 22**

The Clayton State University Library will be closed to the public during the week of Monday May, 18 to Friday, May 22.

According to Clayton State Director of Libraries Dr. Gordon Baker, the carpet tiles in the main portion of the Library are being repaired, refitted and reglued to prevent them from possibly becoming loose. Clayton State students will not be inconvenienced by the closing, since May 18 to May 22 coincides with the University's semester break between the spring and summer semesters.

The Library is expected to reopen to the public on Tuesday, May 26 (Monday, May 25 being Memorial Day.)

### **LaJuan Simpson to Speak at Fayette County Library, May 19**

Dr. LaJuan Simpson has been invited to serve as a speaker at the Fayette County Library on Tuesday, May 19.

The Library is preparing to begin several months' worth of activities in conjunction with its second annual "Fayette on the Page," a countywide "One Book, One Community" initiative, in partnership with Clayton State -- Fayette. The book the Library wants to get everybody in Fayette County reading and talking about this year is "A Lesson Before Dying," by Ernest J. Gaines.

Simpson is a recognized expert on Gaines's work, and thus is the first choice for speaker at our "Fayette on the Page" kickoff event on the evening of Tuesday, May 19. That date is also the first screening in the Library's Ernest Gaines Film Festival. Showing will be "The Autobiography of Miss Jane Pittman" in May; "The Sky is Gray" in June; "A Gathering of Old Men" in July; and "A Lesson Before Dying" in August.

The culminating event for "Fayette on the Page" will be a virtual appearance by Gaines at the Fayette County Library via live video teleconference, free and open to the public, on Thursday, Sept. 10, 2009.

## Clayton State Observes Swine Flu Precautions

Like officials at colleges, universities, and health centers and millions of others in all 50 states, Clayton State leaders are keeping a watchful eye on the latest news from the Centers for Disease Control regarding the H1N1 or Swine Flu. The news media and others are staying on top of the latest developments concerning the H1N1 influenza virus infection in Mexico, and the US. Clayton State has a plan in place that reflects American College Health Association guidelines should an emergency arise.

With a few confirmed cases of the H1N1 Virus in the metro Atlanta area, it's now even more important to recognize the symptoms of the flu and to take precautions to prevent the spread of the virus.

The symptoms of the H1N1 virus in people are similar to the symptoms of regular human seasonal influenza and include:

- Fever
- Lethargy
- Lack of appetite
- Coughing.

Some people with the H1N1 virus also have also reported:

- Runny nose
- Sore throat
- Nausea
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea

Remember these everyday actions to stay healthy.

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it and wash your hands.
- If you don't have a tissue available, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve or elbow, not your hands.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Alcohol-based hands cleaners are also effective.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth at any time. Germs spread that way.

Try to avoid close contact with sick people.

- Influenza is thought to spread mainly person-to-person through coughing or sneezing of infected people.
- If you get sick, stay home from work or school and limit contact with others to keep from infecting them.
