General Program Information

The baccalaureate (BS) program in Criminal Justice prepares graduates for careers in the criminal justice system or graduate school by combining a criminal justice studies with a foundation in the liberal arts and technology.

There are 3 Areas of Concentration within the program: **Administration of Justice; Criminology, Law & Society; Homeland Security & Emergency Management**, or you may select a "General" pathway that allows students to combine upper division coursework (see curriculum guide for details).

A **minor in Criminal Justice** is also available, see website for details.

Course & Curriculum Information

- A current Curriculum Worksheet, listing all courses required for the program may be found at <http://a-s.clayton.edu/cj> under "Curriculum Worksheet".
- Students will complete Areas A—E of the general core curriculum with no specific course requirements. Introduction to Statistics (MATH 1231) OR Selected Topics In Science (SCI 1901F - Forensic Science) is recommended for Area D2.
- Students **MUST** complete a foreign language through the Intermediate I (2001) level; Spanish is recommended.
- Major Specific Electives (Area F) requires completion of Introduction to Criminal Justice (CRJU 1150) and Introduction to Sociology (SOCI 1101). Students must complete 4 additional lower division (1000-2000) electives with the following prefixes: AFAM, ECON, HIST, POLS, PSYC, SOCI, SPAN, WST.
- At the junior-senior level, students will complete 6 required CRJU courses. The remaining coursework will consist of selected concentration area courses and major related electives.
- A minimum CSU GPA of 2.2 is required for students changing their major to Criminal Justice from any other major once enrolled at CSU.
