The Philosophy program prepares graduates to answer fundamental and enduring questions: Who am I? What can I know? How should I act? The Philosophy program at Clayton State University calls on both your creativity and your rigor, uses all your interests and everything you know, from art and literature, history and social sciences, to mathematics and natural sciences. This program makes you articulate in speaking and writing, clear in thinking and reasoning, and able to draw connections among ideas of all kinds.

Primary Skills or Affinities: Openness, curiosity, wonder, critical & creative thinking, wide-ranging interests, spoken & written communication, respect for persons, respect for reasoned discussion, appreciation of difference and diversity.

- Students will complete Areas A—E of the general core curriculum with no specific course requirements.
- Major-Specific Electives (Area F) requires completion of Introduction to World Philosophy (PHIL 2010); Ethics in Historical and Contemporary Perspective (PHIL 2030); Introduction to Aesthetics (PHIL 2040). Students must complete 3 additional lower division (1000-2000) electives from among the following prefixes: HIST, CRJU, FREN, SPAN, POLS, AFAM, WST, PSYC, ART, CMS, COMM, ENGL, MUSIC, THEA, SOCI, MATH, PHYS, BIOL, CHEM
- See the Philosophy Curriculum Guide for upper division major requirements. There are two optional areas of concentration, Pre-Law and Ethical Studies, in addition to the general philosophy track
