3.2 ECON 1101 Survey of Economics	3.2 N. Finlay presented a revised proposal for ECON 1101. This course takes selected topics from ECON 2105 and 2106 and creates a survey course for non School of Business majors and supports joint enrollment of students. 150 students are projected to take the course next semester. If for some reason students take ECON 2105/2106 at a later date, they would not receive credit for ECON 1101 and the upper level courses. Finlay also presented a proposal to include the course in Area E.	3.2 With some minor changes ECON 1101 and the motion to add the course to Area E were approved.
