Converting part-time to full-time. September 17 ribbon cutting for new Sciences Building, work done is incredible. Host Sessions on High Demand Career Initiatives. Provost:

- University has excelled at collecting data for Assessment; however, it is complex scheme. Remodel assessment is a priority. Do what we say we are going to do. Core values Teaching and Curriculum most important thing. Learning is the core mission.
- FNP has 30 students in first year.
- BA Flim first of its kind in Georgia.
- CE Digital Film preparing entry level works.
- College of Business CID Online, BBA Supply Chain Management.
- M.May Affordable Learning project, received 5 different grants.
- Center for Academic Advising will be in old BHS. Made headway. Last year, as we gathered, Faculty were advising a total of 2,007 students. This fall, that number has been reduced by 35 percent, from 2,007 to 1,306 as all of the new students were assigned to full-time advisors. Next fall, we estimate that that number will be cut almost in half to 684.

- Mentoring plan well under way. Burton chairing the task force to continue working on models for faculty mentoring.
- Retention continues to be a challenge. This year will probably be a record high. Will continue to address.
- PACE/EDGE academic and career engagement significant work. Value community engagement and exploration.
- Need volunteers to review courses, form committee and task force for the First Year Experience.
- LEAP-Broad based education. In the long run students better served by mastering one area and knowledge of others. Commencement speaker remarked how fortunate she felt to get a broad based experience, she had no clue what she would be doing once graduating.
- CSU has a solid foundation and it is time to build on that foundation to make better.
- Thanked faculty for working to strengthen our foundation over the past year.
