Biology Major at Clayton State University

According to the National Association of Colleges and Employers Job Outlook Survey, the top five skills employers look for in college graduates are: collaboration, problem solving, analytical/quantitative ability, written communication proficiency, and oral communication proficiency. The Biology Program at Clayton State University is carefully designed to include each of these skills, which students master throughout the curriculum.

Career Possibilities for Biology Majors

Graduates of Clayton State University's biology program often continue to postgraduate study in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, physical therapy, and veterinary medicine. Others work in government agencies, private industries, education, and law enforcement. The Bureau of Labor Statistics projects 16-30 percent growth in healthcare careers for biology majors such as medical and diagnostic technicians, physician's assistants, and genetic counselors. Careers in physical therapy are expected to grow 34 percent by 2024. Starting salaries for these positions range from \$51,000 to \$102,000.

Degree Programs

B.S. in Biology

We offer a general biology degree designed to prepare students for a variety of pathways, including professional schools (medical, dental, veterinary, and others), graduate programs, and career readiness. Students have experiential learning opportunities including undergraduate research projects with the biology faculty.

B.S. in Biology Secondary Education

In addition to the general biology degree, students can also choose to obtain certification in secondary education in preparation to teach high school biology.



I'm delighted to hear of your interest in major in English at Clayton State University. My name is Dr. Mary Lamb, and I am the chair of the Department of English. I'm writing to tell you about the programs and opportunities available to our English majors with the hope that you will consider majoring, or perhaps minoring, in English.

The Clayton State University English major is grounded in a traditional academic discipline rooted in the classics but is also dynamic and contemporary: literature and writing are steeped in culture, everchanging, and integral to life. The English major prepares students for a wide variety of careers, including business, higher education, law, medicine, nonprofits, politics, public relations, publishing, technology, writing, and many more. In fact, the critical and creative thinking and communication skills that English majors develop make them strong candidates in a job market where these abilities are scarce among the candidate pool. Additionally, there are many other benefits to majoring in English, like reading literature that tackles some of humanity's greatest questions, learning to think critically about literary texts and apply their message to contemporary issues and learning to effectively debate and discuss texts and ideas with your peers and professors. Learning about the power of language and its history, developing your writing—creative, professional, and everything in between—and making connections across genres, time periods, and civilizations are also part of the exciting work of an English major. Instead, our English majors learn an array of complex skills—collaboration, problem-solving, creating thinking, and empathy as well as learning to use writing and publishing software; they participate in publishing internships and meet professional writers through the Visiting Writers Reading Series.

In order to accommodate students' busy lives, we offer both online and seated courses, which means you can choose to complete your entire B.A. online, on campus, or a combination of the two. We've also created a combined degree that allows students to earn a Bachelor of Arts in English and a Master of Arts in Liberal Studies in just five years. This way, students who come to Clayton State University intending to earn an M.A. can do so more affordably and efficiently than ever before.

All of these options are available for English minors as well. English majors have the flexibility to minor in other interest areas to bolster their skills, including film, communication and media, history, pre-law, marketing, biology, and psychology. I hope that you will consider majoring in English at Clayton State University and taking advantage of all that our program has to offer. Hello, Future Historians

Memories of childhood history classes have left many with the mistaken impression that history is simply about memorizing dates and names. But it is so much more. The study of the past encourages students to contextualize problems and view those problems from multiple perspectives. History teaches foundational skills in communication, research, and critical thinking. A survey from the American Association of Colleges and Universities shows that employers value precisely these skills in new hires. In a separate survey, history graduates from across the country confirmed that these were the same skills they used at their jobs every day.

Every history major at Clayton State University learns these highly sought-after skills of communication, research, and critical thinking, particularly through the completion of our two-semester thesis project. This project gives students the unique opportunity to conduct original archival research at the National Archives at Atlanta or the Georgia Archives, both of which are adjacent to the Clayton State University campus. No other university in the country is located so closely to two first-rate archival facilities. This distinctive, award-winning thesis project requires students to develop their own research projects, examine and interpret archival documents, and present and write up their findings.

Job opportunities for history majors include those closely related to the discipline, such as work in public history, government and civil service, and archival services. Data from the US Census Bureau, however, reveals that history students find work in a variety of industries not traditionally associated with history. The most popular fields for history graduates are education, management, legal occupations, sales, and office and administration support. Increasingly, students are also working in the growing technology sector. The Clayton State University history program helps our students find their future careers. In addition to the standard history major, the program offers two professional tracks in secondary education and public history. Internships are available, and students have regular opportunities to network with professionals in archival work, public history, and education. Free career services are available to all students. The Clayton State University history program gives students the skills and resources that they need to succeed in today's job market.

B.A. in History and Secondary Education

In addition to the traditional major, Clayton State University also offers several degree options emphasizing teacher preparation in the field of history education. At the undergraduate degree level, students can earn a degree in history which includes Georgia Teacher Certification. Students must apply to the program in the fall of their junior year. In addition to content coursework and the senior thesis, students in the HSTE program complete both a practicum and student teaching internship in a local secondary school throughout their senior year. At the graduate level, students with at least 18 hours of HIST coursework and a 3.0 grade point average are invited to apply for the MAT History program. This streamlined 36-hour program involves both content and pedagogy training. Like the undergraduate counterpart, students take part in a year-long student teaching experience, and the degree carries certification for grades 6-12 in history. 

Degree Programs

B.A. in Film Production

Housed in the multi-disciplinary Visual and Performing Arts department, the Bachelor of Arts in Film Production prepares students for both creative and crew positions in the Georgia film industry. The degree includes coursework relating to pre-production and production with a focus on post-production storytelling tools: compositing,

editing, visual effects, motion graphics, and sound design. Students have the option to include classes and on-set experience with the Georgia Film Academy as part of their degree, or to specialize in courses that develop the personal creative vision and technical skill set of each student. Small course sizes (sixteen students or fewer in most classes) provide students a workshop-like environment in which to develop as filmmakers. Students also have the opportunity to take courses outside of the film area to pursue minor programs to enhance job marketability.

A.A. in Film Production

The Associate of Arts degree in Film Production provides a two-year option for completion of academic credentials in the field of film production, supporting the need for workforce development in Georgia's burgeoning film industry. Students can take GFA courses as part of their curriculum.

Minor in Film
