Fulbright US student Program – The Fulbright awards grants to support study, research, or English teaching abroad in one of over 130 countries. Typically, Fulbright grant winners receive enough funding to support a full academic year in a country. Many Fulbright applicants propose self-designed study or research projects, but there are other opportunities available through the program, including participating in already established research projects and serving as an English teaching Assistant (ETA) <http://us.fulbrightonline.org/>

Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship – The purpose of the Ambassadorial Scholarships program is to further international understanding and friendly relations among people of different countries and geographical areas. Critical Language Scholarship – The critical Language Scholarship (CLS) Program is a fully funded summer overseas language and cultural immersion program for American Undergraduate and graduate students. In its inaugural year, the program offered intensive overseas study in the critical need foreign languages of Arabic, Bangla/Bengali, Hindi, Punjabi, Turkish and Urdu. In 2007, Chinese, Korean, Persian, and Russian institutes.

Gilman Scholarship Program – The Gilman Scholarship Program aims to diversify the kinds of students who study and intern abroad and the countries and region where they go by offering awards to U.S. undergraduates who might otherwise not participate due to financial constraints. The Gilman Scholarship program is open to U.S. citizen undergraduate students who are receiving Federal Pell Grant funding at a two year or four year college or university to participate in study and intern abroad programs worldwide.

Boren Fellowship – Boren Fellowships, an initiative of the National Security Education Program, Provide unique funding opportunities for U.S. graduate students to study less commonly taught languages in world regions critical to U.S. interests, and underrepresented in study abroad, including Africa, Asia, Central and Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America, and the middle East. The countries of Western Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand are excluded.

Rhode Scholarship – The Rhodes Scholarships are the oldest and most celebrated international fellowship awards in the world. Each year 32 young Americans are selected as Rhodes Scholars, through a decentralized process representing the 50 states and the District of Columbia. Rhodes Scholars are chosen not only for their outstanding scholarly achievements, but for their character, commitment to others and to the common good, and for their potential for leadership in whatever domains their careers may lead. The scholarship provides full financial support for Rhode Scholars to pursue a degree at the University of Oxford. <http://www.rhodesscholar.org/>

Marshall Scholarship - Marshall Scholarships finance young Americans of high ability to study for a graduate degree in the United Kingdom. Up to forty Scholars are selected each year to study at graduate level at an UK institution in any field of study. Pickering Fellowship – Funded by the U.S. Department of State and administered by the Washington Center for Internships and Academic Seminars, the 2016 Thomas R. Pickering Fellowship Program provides undergraduate and graduate students with financial support, mentoring and professional development to prepare them academically and professionally for a career in the U.S. Department of State Foreign Service. Women, members of minority groups historically underrepresented in the Foreign Service, and students with financial need are encouraged to apply. Up to \$37,500 annually for tuition, room and board, books, mandatory fees and some travel expenses for the senior year of undergraduate studies, and first year of master's degree in fields related to the Foreign Service such as business administration, economics, public policy, international affairs, and other relevant fields.

Reagan-Fascell Democracy Fellowship – The Reagan-Fascell Democracy Fellows Program hosts democratic activist, scholars, and journalists for five-month fellowships, bringing fresh insights and perspectives to Washington, DC. The fellowship offers an important opportunity to explore new ideas in a comparative context, undertake individual research, and share best practices with one another.
