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Program Mission Statement: Library instruction designed to assist the faculty to create information literate students at Clayton State University by offering instruction classes.

Learning Outcomes

As a result of library instruction, the information literate student will be able to:

- 1. Select appropriate search methods for accessing the needed information. (Related ACRL Frame: <u>Searching as Strategic Exploration</u>) Note: This would include searching Galileo by Subject Databases and using Boolean operators and keywords.
- 2. Identify a variety of types and formats of sources for information. (Related ACRL Frame: Information Creation as a Process) Note: The student will be able to differentiate between primary and secondary sources, books and journals, understanding that their use and importance vary with each discipline.
- 3. Acknowledge their use of information sources through proper attribution. (Related ACRL Frame: <u>Information has Value</u>) Note: The student would correctly use citations in style, content and relevance and demonstrate the ability to locate resources based on citation information.
- 4. Retrieve information using a variety of methods. (Related ACRL Frame: Research as Inquiry; Searching as Strategic Exploration) Note: The student would demonstrate the ability to access streaming videos or other online media sources, as well as use ILL and GIL Express.
- 5. Critically evaluate information resources according to applicable criteria. (Related ACRL Frame: Authority is Constructed and Contextual) Note: This includes distinguishing between scholarly journals, trade publications, and popular magazines, and understanding what peer-reviewed means.
