Amount Requested:\$11,400 for the CHEMATIX modules + \$1,000 Server + \$6,000 hardware for barcode labeling and scanning TOTAL = \$18,400	
Justification:	

The Department of Chemistry and Physics in conjunction with the Department of Biology is requesting a Chemical Inventory System that will be used to manage the chemical inventory stored across campus, specifically in the Chemistry and Biology laboratories. With the addition of Lakeview Discovery and Science Center, CSU now has three campus buildings with multiple science laboratories in them. CSU also has three chemical storage rooms, and approximately 10 chemical preparatory rooms in addition to 8 dedicated faculty research rooms. All of these spaces hold and often store chemicals and chemical waste. The ability of the Laboratory Managers to oversee all of the chemicals in all of these spaces, including the purchasing, storage, use of, disposal of and re-purchasing of each chemicals (our current inventory contains over 1000 compounds in various containers and multiple locations across campus) is greatly hindered by the lack of a chemical management system.

Chemical managements systems provide an easy to use tracking and management platform for laboratory supplies and equipment, both chemical and non-chemical items. The system chosen above allows for user-configured reports and views that allow the user to track specific location inventories, hazardous chemical counts, historical usage data (important for purchasing and cost management) and in general these systems are designed to increase efficiency in inventory management, provide real-time information about chemical quantities (reducing surpluses and saving costs) while also reducing waste disposal costs, enhancing regulatory compliance and providing auditing ability. The CHEMATIX system requested above will work via a barcoding system, where each item receives a barcode upon point of entry and is then tracked via scanning until elimination as waste. This tracking also provides a database of critical safety information about the chemical inventory; including SDS information, hazard ratings, CAS numbers, chemical quantity and chemical location. This is extremely important and a current major safety issue; for example we would be able to tell the fire department exactly what chemicals are located in a particular lab

and how much of each chemical is present at any particular time, whereas right now all we can do it provide the fire department with a list of over 1000 compounds and their SDS sheets. The system will also help keep us in compliance with Cindy Knight and the Office of Risk Management, allowing for more accurate reporting and regulatory compliance requirements. We will also be better able to track and eliminate expired chemicals, specifically potentially explosive chemicals and hazardous chemicals, PECs, Flammables etc. on campus.

The CHEMATIX system, included in this proposal was developed at UGA and is used at many of the BOR system schools. The system chosen here is a self-contained system where we purchase the licenses for both the CHEMATIX Inventory and Resource Management Module and the Waste Management Module. The proposal is to purchase resources for 20 laboratory spaces and an unlimited number of users. We will also need to purchase a server and the hardware for bar code labeling and scanning. CSU then owns the system and is able to use the system independently for many years. Upgrades, maintenance and support run at 10% of the license purchase agreement price and could be purchased as necessary after year 1 as a shared cost between the departments that use the system.

Description: The Department of Dental Hygiene needs funding to purchase a replacement for our aging and obsolete panoramic X-ray machine.

Amount Requested: \$28,475.00

Justification: The panoramic x-ray machine is essential to the delivery of dental hygiene oral care and plays an integral part in the training of radiologic procedures for our dental hygiene students. The CSU Dental Hygiene clinic is equipped with a single panoramic unit, which serves the 56 students in the program and approximately 6,000 patients of record with no backup device. To adhere to the standards of dental care, provide an optimal learning experience to students and a safe environment to patients, all necessary dental equipment must be in working order.

Our existing machine was donated in used condition to the program over 13 years ago. It has not functioned optimally for the last year and has consistently yielded radiographs of poor diagnostic quality.

Because the machine was manufactured before the dental profession adopted digital sensors as standard, it had to be retrofitted to expose with the new technology. Numerous costly attempts at repairs, calibrations and servicing have failed to correct issues with poor exposures. The last service call technician observed that the machine was on its last legs.

More important than the diagnostic quality of radiographs being produced, the poor results of our current unit present a potential safety issue for our patients. When diagnostic radiographs are not achieved, a second attempt is often required. This results in patients receiving exposure to ionizing radiation in excess of that necessary to achieve the correct exposure with properly operating modern equipment in a single take.

It is crucial to our program to secure funding to purchase this equipment to enhance our students' learning experiences and provide a safe environment.

Description: Electrocardiogram (ECG) Stress Module - Health & Fitness Management (HFMG) Program

Amount Requested: \$26,634

Justification: The addition of the ECG Stress Module to our current laboratory equipment is invaluable and required for student learning and success. Last year, the laboratory purchased a metabolic cart. This module is needed to function with the metabolic cart. It will provide students with exposure to the type of technology used at the clinical, higher education/graduate and field levels. This is particularly true in the competitive area of clinical exercise physiology, where a large number of HFMG majors have demonstrated an interest by completing 225 hours of internship during their senior year. Moreover, it will better prepare them for portions of the American College of Sports Medicine's (ACSM) Certified Exercise Physiologist examination that is used for accreditation purposed by COAES (Committee on accreditation for exercise science programs). The examination and Job task Analysis for accreditation include principles of electrocardiography. It is an area that students historically perform poorly because they are not exposed to such a content. Therefore, this equipment will improve student knowledge, abilities and skills, which will be beneficial for both certification, accreditation, internships in the clinical field, and future employment opportunities in sport performance, health and fitness.

The ECG module will teach students how to prepare subjects for ECG measurement in a variety of settings, including research, clinical, and sports performance. ECG is short for electrocardiogram. It is used to record the electrical activity of the heart from different angles to identify and locate pathology. Electrodes are placed on different parts of a patient's limbs & chest to record the signal. It is the best way to identify and diagnose abnormal rhythms of the heart.

Students will learn about the basics of reading an ECG and how to recognize normal and abnormal heart rhythms. This module will reinforce topics related to the function of the heart through hands-on practical experiences which are important in terms of career preparation especially in the clinical world. The ECG module records the electrical activity in the heart that flows in many directions at once. The activity is printed on paper. The flows are described by different aspects of waves on that ECG report. The wave seen represents the average direction. The height of the deflection also represents the amount of electricity flowing in that direction. The lead, which refers to an imaginary line between two ECG electrodes, with the most positive velocity deflection is closest to the direction the hearts electricity is flowing. Students will learn about these components which are being tested on the national certification taken during the capstone course HFMG 4999.

In order to create a stressful situation for the body, we use exercise. Exercise on a bike, exercise on a treadmill. Both are valuable pieces of equipment that are parts of the quote. The issue we are having right now is that our equipment does not directly connect with the metabolic cart.

Each exercise protocol is dictated by the module that will be run by the metabolic cart directly. T faculty choices a certain protocol among multiple ones present in the software system of the ECG module. With the addition of the connecting equipment pieces (bike, and Treadmill), the system will run the protocol automatically and will send a signal to the equipment to increase speed, grade etc in order to stress the heart and record the ECG on the screen available for e-download and/or printable for a direct analysis by students as part of the course.

Description: BioPac MP45 Data Acquisition Units for Human Anatomy and Physiology lab classes

Amount Requested:\$34,210
Justification: The 1000 level Anatomy and Physiology courses are required by all health science programs. We
currently use an online simulation program (PhysioEx) to teach physiological concepts that is disliked by faculty and
students alike. In response to the question, "Which labs did you like the least?" 44% of A&P I students and 65% of
A&P II students responded that the PhysioEx Labs were the least liked. The higher percentage of A&P II students
disliking the program may be the result of more PhysioEx simulations used in this lab class. Students described the
labs as boring, long, time-consuming, waste of time, confusing, ineffective, not "hands on", and terrible. Students
have a difficult time extracting the concepts from the program and the program locks faculty and students into a
regimented demonstration of physiological concepts that are essential to understand. This lack of flexibility makes it
difficult for students to ask questions about the concepts and alienates a number of students from the study of
physiology. All A&P faculty would like to see this simulation program replaced by meaningful physiology activities
in the class.

The MP45 data acquisition units that we are requesting are specifically designed for lower level health science classes. The MP45, which comes with free software for the students, will allow students to explore electromyography, electroencephalography, electrocardiography, pulmonary function, blood pressure, and heart sounds. The lessons that were developed using the data acquisition units and their accessories allow flexibility for the instructor and could lead to more meaningful investigations of muscle, brain and lung function. Students can design their own experiments, collect, and analyze data on their own computers. Much of the physiological measurements that students can take of these functions would be the same types of measurements they would be asked to interpret as a health science student and professional. Real time measurements in response to different conditions would be more engaging for students. This is a very challenging course for students with DFW rates ranging from 25 – 40 percent. We believe this software may contribute to student success.

BioPac data acquisition units are currently being used in the Health Fitness Management program and so use in the lower level A&P classes would prepare students for their use in that program.

Justification:

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The Media Design Lab is a heavily-used computer classroom and lab space in the Music Education Building. The room is used throughout the week as a classroom for many courses in the Film Production and CMS programs as well as for a design course in the Art minor program. The room is also used by the Film and Digital Media Center instructors and students two nights each week. Additionally, students use this room outside of class, throughout the week and during weekends, to complete video and audio projects for these classes.

Due to technical requirements and industry standards for these courses, this is (and must remain) a Mac lab. The MacPro computers that are currently in place are at least six years old; many of these machines are beginning to fail and will soon have to be replaced. Though replacing hard drives is possible, the fact that the computers simply cannot keep pace with contemporary video resolutions is a much larger issue. The current MacPros are unable to process the high-resolution video footage from 2K and 4K cameras which were recently purchased to support the new B.A. in Film Production. The aging Dell monitors currently in place do not provide a color-accurate representation of the work students are creating. The computers also do not display high resolution video properly as their top resolution is HD quality or below. In short, the current setup does not accurately mirror workflows in place in the industry.

A cost effective solution would be the purchase of seventeen 5k iMac desktop computers (16 student stations and one for the instructor station). These computers, when properly configured, are capable of displaying full-resolution 4k video, running the latest editing and image editing software compatible with 4k video, and offer a color-accurate display for color grading. This all-in-one solution is about half the price of refurbishing the lab with MacPros. The attached quote includes the cost of Apple Care, Apple's warranty plan that fully covers all repairs for three years. We have also added four "time capsules" to this estimate. These wireless backup drives ensure that all student work is backed up once each hour for every computer in the lab. We currently have two that are in use in the lab and with the addition of four more, we will have enough to backup all student work. We will be able to reinstall all currently installed software on the new computers without additional cost.

The lab will, undoubtedly, be an attraction for both current and prospective students and will ensure our students are on the leading edge of filmmaking workflows. Our new B.A. in Film Production includes a strong emphasis on post-production, which makes our Media Design Lab a vital component of the program's physical plant. Replacing this equipment is necessary for ensuring that this lab will continue to meet the needs of our students, particularly in our new Film Production degree programs.

Amount Requested: \$25,156,74

Justification: Please note that this request was part of the original project scope that was approved but excluded from 2014-2015 year-end funding requests due to limited construction resources. An associated request has been submitted and approved related to the construction costs by facilities. This request represents the non-construction costs associated with the completion of Phase II construction of the Center for Advising & Retention (CAR). Phase Il of construction will increase the student reception space as well as the student self-service space. Since the CAR opened on September 1, 2015 we had served in our offices more than 4,500 students with a peak of more than 1,700 students in the month of October. During these peak times it is not uncommon to have more than 20 students waiting in the CAR for their advising appointments. The additional technology and furniture will allow us to decrease wait times for self-service registration kiosks and appointment scheduling. Eliminating this barrier increases efficiency and allows the CAR advisors to have students register for future terms before leaving the center and decreases the needs for follow up calls and emails. The additional furniture is also needed for Amy Albrecht's office, which was excluded from Phase I construction and was not included in the original CAR furniture allocation. Amy's desk also includes ADA functionality to keep us in compliance with her approved workplace accommodations. This request represents the remaining items needed to finish the CAR construction project.

Description: The requested funding is for renovation of an existing space which will have three purposes.

- 1. One is to establish a cross-campus, cross-disciplinary work space for Clayton State University students to brainstorm, identify new ideas, new solutions, and new products and services, as well as work on community-based projects. Development of this dedicated workspace to creativity, innovation, and entrepreneurship will encourage "outside of the box" thinking in identifying problems, both social and business and creating solutions to these problems.
- 2. Two, this space will be available to high school students visiting the campus and for high school competitions related to innovation and entrepreneurship. It is hoped that this space will "wow" high school students and encourage them to attend CSU regardless of major since this space has a campuswide emphasis.
- 3. Third, this space will be used to provide classes, instruction, and speakers both in person and electronically on topics related to creativity, innovation, design thinking, and entrepreneurship. It is space where students can develop prototypes of their ideas for products.

The creative space can named in a way that is unique to CSU. Some possible names are "Laker Lair", "Lochovator" (Loch and innovator), "InnoLaker" or something similar Having a naming contest would publicize it to campus.

Amount Requested: \$30,000.00

Justification: There is increasing emphasis on entrepreneurship and innovation within the university, within the University System of Georgia, and in Clayton County. Now, at CSU, we have a minor in entrepreneurship and innovation open to all majors, elevator pitch competitions, and a new course in Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship. We have just started an entrepreneurship club. Just for the first meeting, almost 30 students were interested in the club. In my classes, both undergraduate and graduate, about 2/3 of the students indicate that they are interested in entrepreneurship and innovation. For some, their interest is in being more creative and innovative in a corporate environment. Others are interested in starting their own businesses. A survey in 2014 found that 63% of millennials were interested in starting their own businesses or had thought about it. In today's economy, with difficulty in finding employment, our students can create their own jobs. According to Abraham Lincoln and Peter Drucker, the best way to predict the future is to create it. Today, we are educating students for jobs that do not exist today. The skills and knowledge that our student will acquire can be used in almost any job.

Encouraging students to develop these skills will differentiate them from college students at other universities. If two students have a major in biology, and one of them also has a background in innovation, the one with the innovation background differentiates him/herself from other biology majors. It will also encourage economic development and entrepreneurial activity of our students who very easily could establish their businesses in Clayton County. We can help our students create their futures. Employers want problem-solvers.

This type of facility encourages experiential, practical, hands-on learning with real problems.

It will help make CSU unique among other universities. There are no other universities, with the exception of major universities who offer this type of opportunity. A space dedicated to brainstorming, creative problem-solving will differentiate CSU from other universities. It will help us to attract those better students who are now passing by CSU to attend other universities.

Finally, this effort is in line with the county's interest in developing an incubator/accelerator facility. This workspace would be a step in that direction to support such an effort.

USES OF FUNDING

The money requested will be used to develop a space (currently a conference room on the 2nd floor of the College of Business) which will two 3D printers for students to develop prototypes of their ideas, a smart screen that will be used to video conference speakers from other parts of the country, white walls on which students can write and draw their ideas during brainstorming, and modular furniture can be easily moved and easily re-configured to accommodate multiple teams, or to accommodate different size teams. These same materials and space design are used by much larger universities in their areas for creative problem-solving. The break-down of costs are as follows:

- a. Two 3D printers: \$10,000 for developing prototypes
- b. Smart screen \$6,000 for programs, training, speakers, and communication
- c. White walls \$3,000 to brainstorm and draw ideas
- d. Modular furniture, \$10,000
- e. Additional electrical outlets for students laptops \$1,000

TOTAL = \$30,000

SUMMARY

This request is aligned with the goals and strategy of both the University System of Georgia, Clayton State University, and of Clayton County. It will encourage creative problem-solving (critical thinking) and learning by doing, by working on real-life problems. It is a facility that is for all students and will encourage collaboration across colleges through cross-disciplinary problem-solving teams.

graduate from the nursing program, pass the national RN licensure exam, and succeed in their
