

SPRING 2019 Undergraduate Commencement Ceremony

Tickets	<p>Detailed information regarding the number of tickets will be determined once we know how many students elect to participate in the ceremony. Alternate Viewing	Friends and family may view the live webcast in the Ballroom in the Student Activity Center located on the Clayton State University campus. <u>No tickets are required; however, seating is limited to the first 525 guests.</u> Once the SAC is filled, there will be additional seating in The University Center-Room 272 and 267 if needed. Beginning approximately one week after the ceremony, it will be available for viewing on demand at www.clayton.edu
Caps & Gowns	Last day to purchase cap & gown is April 15, 2019. You will need to order your cap & gown from: https://clayton.shopoakhalli.com/ . The Registrar's Office is not involved in the order/purchase of caps & gowns.

Photographs	<p>Students participating in the graduation ceremony will have an opportunity to purchase individual photographs from a professional photographer. Diplomas	<p>Because all final grades will not be reported to the Office of the Registrar until after commencement, we will not be distributing diplomas at the ceremony. We will be conducting final audits of all graduates in the weeks following commencement.</p> <p>Diplomas for SPRING graduates will be available approximately 8 weeks after Commencement. You will be notified by mail and email when your diploma is ready. Please ensure that the Office of the Registrar has your current address and phone numbers on file by logging onto the DUCK. Please make sure to deactivate any addresses that are no longer correct or current.</p>
Parking	<p>Please advise your guests that parking will be limited and they should arrive early in order to allow adequate time to find a parking space.</p> <p>ALL guests must arrive and be seated before the processional begins. Guests will not be admitted late.</p>
Disability Accommodations	<p>Disability accommodations can be provided upon request for graduates and guests with disabilities. Recognized Honors, Fraternities, and Sororities	<p>Clayton State University strives to recognize the exemplary accomplishments of our graduates. Students who are qualified members of nationally-recognized honor societies or nationally-recognized registered student organizations (ex. fraternities and sororities) that are also recognized at the institution, during their studies at Clayton State University have been granted authorization to wear regalia from those organizations during the Commencement ceremonies. The only types of regalia items that may be approved are honor cords or stoles. Please note that all regalia requirements as specified by the Registrar's Office for graduation should be followed and supersede additional student organization regalia requirements. Unauthorized ornamentation is prohibited. If your item is not on the list above, you may not wear it during the ceremony. If any university official deems the attire to be inappropriate, the student will be asked to remove the unapproved item or the student may be denied participation in the graduation ceremony.
