Choosing Your Major

Do you need help in making your big decision?

uture college students have two difficult questions that only they can answer, with lots of input from family and friends, of course: 1) where should I go for my higher education, and 2) what should I study? Even after deciding which school to attend, the question of major can be a difficult one to answer. After all, most people have a variety of subjects, issues, and skills they enjoy—and narrowing them all down into the one major that will likely lead to a future career can cause a lot of stress and second-guessing.

Clayton State University requires prospective students to list their expected majors on their applications, and there's no "undecided" option. So, if you're pondering what to list in that blank space, here is some helpful information.

- You can check out <u>www.GAcollege411.org/</u>. Just click on the "Explore Careers" link. If you need more guidance, click "Career Assessments" and take their selfassessment quizzes.
- The College Board web site has a great section listing profiles for every possible major, and which universities offer them. Go to <u>www.collegeboard.com</u>, and then type "majors and careers central" into their search engine.
- The Clayton State University web site has a lot of great information about the major programs of study and degrees offered. Just go to www.clayton.edu, and then click on "Academic Programs". You'll find all the departments and schools listed here, with links to their own web

pages. So, for example, if you're interested in studying business, click on the "School of Business" link and you'll find information about all the various majors programs: accounting, general business, management, and marketing.

 Did you know at Clayton State, you have the option of creating your own course of study? Liberal Studies (for liberal arts-based programs) or Integrative Studies (for science-based programs) can let you combine different courses to create a program that works for you. For example, if you want a career running your own online business, you could create a curriculum involving classes in both information technology and business. You'll have to work with an advisor to design your program.

Don't forget: even though you have to start with a major, you can change your mind, preferably before you begin your junior year. You may choose computer science as a freshman, and then after some composition classes decide that English is a better fit, with technical writing as your anticipated career. Luckily, that's what college is all about: taking time to discover what matters to you, and how you can make a difference in the world.



Making Sense of Application Paperwork

Completing your application file can be easy if you're organized!

very semester, admissions counselors review stacks of application files carefully, using the information provided to decide whether or not prospective students meet the requirements for admission to Clayton State University. Some students submit their applications early and with all necessary components in place, ready to work with the counselors to provide additional information if necessary. Other students wait until the last minute, filling in blanks and throwing paperwork together—and then hope that it all works out. Can you tell which students are more likely to get acceptance letters and have a better transition to college?

Remember: students are not considered for admission until their files are complete. Be sure to submit all necessary paperwork early if possible—and definitely by the deadline!

Here's a list of all required items for application to Clayton State:

- · A completed application for admission
- You can fill out an application online at <u>www.clayton.edu</u> or <u>www.gacollege411.org</u>
- If using a paper application, be sure all blanks are filled in and your application is signed.
- A \$40.00 nonrefundable application fee
- If you apply online, you'll need to use a credit or debit card
- If using a paper application, please enclose a check or money order made out to Clayton State University with the application.
- You may be eligible for an application fee waiver through College Board. For more information, go to <u>www.college-board.com/student/testing/sat/calenfees/feewaivers.html</u>.
- · Your official high school transcript
- If you haven't graduated yet, you'll need to send a preliminary transcript. Then, after graduation you'll submit an official final transcript.
- Your transcript must be in an unopened, sealed envelope with the high school seal. You can deliver it yourself (it must stay sealed!), or request your high school send it.
- Your SAT and/or ACT scores

- When you take these tests, request that your scores be sent directly to Clayton State University. Clayton State's code is 5145 for the SAT and 0803 for the ACT.
- If you didn't originally request your scores be sent to Clayton State, you can still have them sent by visiting the below Web sites:

If you are admitted to Clayton State, you'll also be required to submit a certificate of immunization.

Download the form on <u>www.clayton.edu</u>. The form must be completed and signed by a doctor, nurse practitioner, or health department official.

If you're a Georgia resident, your doctor can use the Georgia Immunization Registry (GRITS) to download a form.



Take I-75 to exit 233 (15 miles south of downtown Atlanta). Turn left and follow the green and white signs for 1-1/2 miles north on Georgia Highway 54. Turn right onto Clayton State Boulevard.

From I-675

Take I-675 to exit 5 west and continue straight on Forest Parkway for two miles. Turn left onto North Parkway. At the first traffic light, Harper Drive, North Parkway becomes North Lee Street. Continue straight on North Lee Street for one block to the next traffic light. Turn left onto Clayton State Boulevard.
