Narrative Statement of Qualifications (to be completed by chair or dean):

1. What evidence exists that the coordinator has the qualifications and credentials for leadership in the development and review of the curriculum?

The coordinator has an EdD in Educational Leader in Policy Analysis with an emphasis on program evaluation. He has a master's degree in curriculum and instruction. He has twenty five years experience as a middle school and high school administrator and was actively involved in development, implementation, and evaluation of new curricula. He is well-versed in both Understanding by Design and curriculum mapping and has implemented both in practice as well as having attended numerous national workshops dealing with both. He has served in a similar capacity (coordinator) in an established MAT program and has taught graduate level courses in that program in the areas of curriculum, foundations, assessment, and research. He has served as a curriculum adviser for a charter school and current serves on the board of directors of another charter school. He has contributed to the alignment of curricula developed by the Southern Center for International Studies and Art in History with the Georgia Performance Standards. Throughout his career he has served on curriculum committees, and has been responsible for coordinating curriculum change proposals in a variety of situations 2. What evidence exists that the coordinator provides oversight for assessing the quality of the curriculum for the program and for ensuring that the curriculum and its delivery are educationally sound?

The MAT program is currently in its second semester of implementation. All MAT programs must be approved by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission, but these programs can differ in requirements and course requirements in order to reflect individual college and university characteristics. However, one expectation is that the MAT program and entire Teacher Education unit continuously evaluate every component of the program. Through established checkpoints (both for individual students and for the program) these metrics are established and the results documented. The Unit Assessment Review Panel, of which the coordinator is a member, provides the mechanism for analyzing that data.
