FNP Program fee	Review Comments: Expenditures appear to match the original proposal except bio waste disposal. The committee feels this expense is acceptable and should be added to FY21 application. The budget appears to be managed well. Application Comments: The budget manager needs to create two separate applications: one for the course fee for the NURS 6690 course, which is \$319 per student, and one for the program fee decreasing to \$480. Explain these separately. The program goes to the BOR so mentioning the course fee within it can complicate things. Budget manager asked to reduce the course fee from \$469 to \$319 starting in FY20 (less expensive assessment). Appeal Comments: The committee felt that having these two fees separated into two applications and reviews made it a lot easier to review. The committee approved the two fees and these will now be listed separately: Course fee and program fee.  - O Description of how the fee revenue will be spent (be as specific as possible). The one-time program fee of \$480.00 will be collected when the student is accepted to the FNP program. The revenue collected will grant FNP students access to academic resources that are not available in the FNP curriculum in the first four semesters of the program.
- \$480 revenue collected will be spent as follows:
 - \$50 dollars for the ACEMAPP documentation system: (20 students x \$50) = \$1000. The system allows students to upload compliance documents, maintains all clinical hours completed by the student while in the FNP program, a repository for patients managed by students, provides access for faculty to evaluate student documentation on patients managed by students and, access to student evaluations of clinical sites and their preceptors.
 - o \$50 dollars for lab course fee (20 students x \$50) = \$1000.00. This fee covers supplies and maintenance of simulation mannequins and replacement of lab equipment as needed.
 - o \$300.00 for clinical skills USA (20 students x \$300) = \$6000.00. This fee covers a life Model Service that allows FNP students to learn advanced and realistic assessment skills by performing gynecological, prostate, testicular and clinical breast exams on humans versus mannequins. Students are provided handouts and access to the CSUSA site to review these skills for up to one year after graduation.
 - \$30.00 Exploring the top 20 prescribed drugs: (20 students x 29.95) = \$600.00 This is a self-study pharmacology review of commonly prescribed medications ranging from cardiovascular disease, pain, infections, endocrine disorders, the top 20 street and abused drugs and the populations that use these drugs. Nurse practitioner students have identified pharmacology as one of the challenging courses in the curriculum needing constant review. Access to this self-study module will enhance student success on the Nurse Practitioner certification exam.
 - \$50.00 for Interpretation of 12 Lead EKGs: (20 students x 49.95 = \$1000.00). Content on interpretation of electrocardiograms (EKGs) is not required in the NP curriculum however, this skill is required in primary care clinics and on certification exams. The self-study module will be a resource in the curriculum to enhance student success on the certification exam prior to when the content is integrated in the FNP program.

The fee to be collected in 2020 per student at the beginning of the semester when the student is accepted to the program is (50 + 50 + 300 + 30 + 50) = \$480.00

Justify why the program's department/college budget cannot support these expenditures.

• The charged resources are used for individual student benefit as they matriculate through the program. The items are enhancements to the FNP program and, not included in the program curriculum provided by the school of nursing.

Describe the benefit this revenue will provide to the students who are paying it.

- The opportunity to learn advanced assessment skills on real humans from Clinical Skills USA, versus on mannequins. The experience strengthens student confidence in performing gynecological/testicular/prostate/ and clinical breast exams accurately on real humans. The current CSUSA realistic assessments/procedures are available to students online for up to 2 years after they graduate.
- The self-study modules on commonly prescribed pharmacology drugs and EKG interpretation are resources that will enhance student preparation for the Nurse Practitioner certification exam. The modules will strengthen commonly identified weaknesses in FNP curriculum content and, enhance certification pass rates and program accreditation. Students are able to review content from the comfort of home or anywhere and anytime.
