SCAPFAC Recommendation: The FNP program fee will be reduced in FY20 from a one time fee of \$1,029 to a one time fee of \$481 and a course fee charged when students are enrolled in NURS 6690 of \$469. The one time fee revenue will cover the expenses that are associated with multiple courses and the course fee revenue will cover the cost of the FHEA review that occurs in NURS 6690 course. Making this change will alleviate some of the concern about students dropping out after the first year and losing a lot of money and would likely make the cost of the program more accessible (spreading the expense out). Dr. Scott did not appeal this recommendation. The two fees will require BOR approval.

 - o Description of how the fee revenue will be spent (be as specific as possible).

The FNP program fee is a one time fee of \$949.60 which is collected at the beginning of the semester when the student is admitted to the program. The revenue collected will be used to enhance student learning by providing access to additional academic resources that are not available in the FNP education curriculum. Students will be able to access the following services:

- \$468.65 for Fitzgerald Health Education Associates (FHEA) review –(20 students x \$468.05) = \$9,361.00. The "FHEA" review course is implemented during the student's last clinical course, NURS 6690. All students in the clinical course will receive a review book, access to online quizzes, a pre- post and, a predictor exit exam. FHEA will provide an analysis of test results for all students.
- \$50 for Acemapp/student (20 students x 50) = \$1000. This fee is for a documentation system that allows the students to upload compliance documents, maintain all clinical hours completed by each student, stores documents on patients managed by students and allow faculty to grade student documentation and evaluate clinical sites. In addition, it keeps up with the all the student clinical logs and compliance paperwork needed for each student for accreditation purposes.
- \$49.00 for FHEA Comprehensive Questions for Family Nurse Practitioner Certification- (20 students x 49.00 = \$980.00). This is an intensive, condensed and focused preparation test for the FNP certification exam. This test confirms that the student has the knowledge and is ready to take the certification exam.
- \$31.95 for the Advance Practice Education Associates (APEA) Adult Gerontology Predictive Exam (20 students x 31.95 = \$630.00. The Adult Gerontology course does not have an exit or predictor exam at the completion of the course. The predictor exam will provide an analysis of student performance and weak areas to be strengthen prior to beginning the final clinical course in the FNP program.

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- \$300.00 for Clinical Skills USA (20 students x & 300) = \$6000.00. This fee covers a live Model Service that allows FNP students to learn advanced and realistic assessment skills by performing gynecological, prostate, testicular and clinical breast exams on humans versus mannequins. Students are provided handouts and access to the CSUSA site to review these skills.
- \$50/clinical or lab course fee (20 students x \$50.00) = \$1,000.00. This fee covers supplies and maintenance of simulation mannequins and replacement of lab equipment as needed.

Based on the information in item A, the fee to be collected in 2019 per student is (\$468.65 + 50 + 49 + 31.95 + 300 + 50) = \$949.6

B. Justify why the program's department/college budget cannot support these expenditures.

Students are expected to pay the FNP program fee because the items charged are enhancements to the education program and, are not included in the program curriculum provided by the school of nursing. The charged resources are used for individual student benefit.

- C. Describe the benefit this revenue will provide to the students who are paying it.
 - A certification review course by Fitzgerald Health Education Associates (FHEA). The review course is used throughout the last semester in the final clinical course to prepare the student for the certification exam. The certification exam pass rates is a standard by which the program is evaluated and accredited. Students are provided with a FHEA review book and access to online quizzes, pre & post exams, and an exit exam.
 - FHEA comprehensive questions for Family Nurse Practitioner Certification: After a review course, it is recommended that students allow a minimum of 4-6 weeks of planned study to maximize their chances of success on the certification exam. Students who are not successful in the FHEA exit exam review do not have access to a remediation plan. The FHEA comprehensive questions is an intensive condensed and focus preparation test for the certification exam. It confirms that the student has had the knowledge and is ready to take the certification exam. If the pass rate on the certification exam does not meet minimum standards, the FNP program is less likely to be re-accredited through nursing's professional accreditation body.

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- The opportunity to learn advanced assessment skills on real patients from Clinical Skills USA, versus on mannequins. The experience strengthens student confidence in performing gynecological/testicular/prostate/ and clinical breast exams accurately on real humans. The current CSUSA realistic assessments/procedures are available to students online for up to 2 years after they graduate.

 - The student pass rates on the certification exam will be negatively affected. Certification pass rates is a standard by which the FNP program is evaluated and accredited. Low passage rates will jeopardize program accreditation and Georgia Board of Nursing program approval.

 - -Replacement of Laboratory Supplies as needed
 - Justify why the program's department/college budget cannot support these expenditures. Allocated budgets for the School of Nursing were developed prior to the implementation of the nursing simulation lab; therefore, our nursing program state allocated budget doesn't address expenses associated with running a high fidelity simulation lab. The School of Nursing budget is insufficient to cover the cost of standardized testing for students required to prepare them to take State Board Exams.
 - O Describe the benefit this revenue will provide to the students who are paying it. These fees allow our students experiential experiences such as high fidelity simulation and items need to practice basic nursing skills in a safe environment prior to practicing on patients. Testing will allow the faculty members to evaluate our students' progress in the program and compare our students outcomes to similar in other benchmarked schools. Experience in the simulation lab is likely to increase success on RN Licensure Examination.
 - If your request is denied describe what impact this will have on your program.
 This would be a great disadvantage to the students and would not allow faculty to evaluate the effectiveness of teaching strategies used within the program and significantly decrease our students' chances of success on RN Licensure Examination. This could impact our accreditation status with both the GA Board of Nursing and CCNE.

NURS 3202 Lab Fee \$35/course	Original review: The revenue was \$945 and the expenses were \$935,36 which left a balance of \$9,64 (1% of revenue). The budget manager did a great job of spending the fees this year. The committee would recommend providing more detail about the "office supplies" purchased for the lab from Staples. Other departments provide a lot more detail about what was purchased. The narrative was missing and should be included in the future. It is not clear if students paying this fee are also paying the nursing program fee. Since there was no narrative the committee was uncertain. On the form HLTH 3202 is listed, but this is actually for NURS 3202 and that should be corrected on the form in the future as it caused a lot of confusion by the committee. The committee recommended an appeal addressing the requirement to purchase office supplies using this fee prior to our approval for FY20. Appeal: An appeal was submitted explaining that the office supplies include paper, supplies and toner that is used directly by the students taking the NURS 3202 course. It was also explained that students who take this course for the RN to BSN program do not pay the BSN program fee. The committee felt the fee was justified after the appeal. First of all, there seems to be some confusion regarding the correct prefix for the RN-BSN course in question. Although, I do not know exactly why, it has been referenced as HLTH 3202, but it should be listed as NURS 3202 and will be correctly moving forward. Thanks for bringing this to our attention.

The program fee the committee keeps referring to is for the traditional, pre-licensure BSN program only. The RN-BSN track is a separate track in the undergraduate program. This is mostly an online degree plan targeted to registered nurses who entered into the profession at the associate degree level, and now want to earn a baccalaureate degree. As such, a program fee is not collected from these students. This is a much smaller track, but still extant, to meet the educational needs of the professional nursing community. As such, NURS 3202 collects a course fee from students to cover cost of materials and supplies used in the practicum/skill based sessions in the simulation lab on campus.

This is essentially the only time these students are actually on-site. The students, therefore, make the most of the experience by printing and copying most of the materials needed for their external preceptorships which they are released to at the end of their practicum. A question has been raised about the necessity of charging items to Staples when actually the course focuses on basic health assessment. The reality is most of the course fee covers items such as copier toner and printer paper. Students copy quite a bit of helpful information needed for the next phase of the course which occurs off campus. Of the \$945 dollars charged in this department for the course, \$510.36 was spent on these types of office items. This includes various printed evaluation rubrics needed by them, and their preceptors, as they proceed with the rest of the course. The rest of the charges went towards a Pocket Nurse® Simulation Model which all the students utilize in the onsite session. I believe this left a balance of \$9.64. I hope this is sufficient in explaining why this course fee is collected. Please inform me if additional clarification is needed. WMS
